MATERIALS

Fabric yardage assumes 40" usable width of fabric (WOF) unless otherwise noted. Although fabric amounts are adequate for foundation piecing, you may need more if you cut very generous patches.

- ▶ 6¾ yards white batik for units, sections, and blocks
- 1½ yards medium blue batik for units, sections, and blocks
- 1% yards turquoise batik for units, sections, and blocks
- 3 yards green batik for units, sections, border 2, and binding
- 1¾ yards cream batik for units, sections, and blocks
- 2 yards gray batik for units, sections, and blocks
- 1½ yards light blue batik for sections and blocks
- 1½ yards medium aqua batik for units, sections, and blocks
- ¾ yard light aqua batik for units, sections, and blocks
- Foundation paper
- 10 yards backing fabric
- 113" x 113" batting

Fabric: 1895 Watercolors, Hand-dyed Mottles, and Dot batiks all from Hoffman California Fabrics



CUTTING

Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Cut foundation patches at least 1" larger than corresponding foundation areas.

 $\square = \text{cut in half once diagonally}$ $\square = \text{cut in half twice diagonally}$

FROM WHITE BATIK, CUT:

- 4 strips 7¹/₄"-wide, subcut:
 - 19 squares 7¼" cut ⊠ to make 76 triangles (M)
- 1 strip 67/8"-wide, subcut:
 - 4 squares 6⁷/₈" cut □ to make 8 triangles (N)
- 4 strips 4¹/₄"-wide, subcut:
 - 36 squares 4¼" cut ⊠ to make 144 triangles (C)
- 1 strip 3⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 4 squares 3⁷/₈" cut □ to make 8 triangles (D)
 - 6 squares 3" cut ⊠ to make 24 triangles (F)
- 2 strips 3"-wide, subcut:
 - 26 squares 3" cut ⊠ to make 104 triangles (F)
- 1 strip 2⁵/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 8 squares 25/8" (O)
 - 8 squares 2³/₈" cut □ to make 16 triangles (I)
- 1 strip 2³/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 16 squares 2³/₈" (A)
- 2 strips 2"-wide, subcut:
 - 16 rectangles 2" x 3½" (K)
- 1 strip 1³/₄"-wide, subcut:
 - 16 squares 1³/₄" (H)
- Foundation patches

FROM MEDIUM BLUE BATIK, CUT:

- 1 strip 6¹/₂"-wide, subcut:
 - 4 squares 6¹/₂" (L)
- 2 strips 3⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 16 squares 3⁷/₈" cut ⊠ to make 32 triangles (D)
 - 8 squares 1³/₄" (H)
- 1 strip 3¹/₂"-wide, subcut:
 - 8 squares 3¹/₂" (B)
- 1 strip 2³/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 8 squares 2³/₈" (A)
 - 4 squares 2³/₈" cut □ to make 8 triangles (I)
- 1 strip 2"-wide, subcut:
 - 16 squares 2" (J)
- Foundation patches

FROM TURQUOISE BATIK, CUT:

- 11 strips 1¹/₂"-wide for border 1
- 1 strip 6⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 4 squares 6⁷/₈" cut □ to make 8 triangles (N)
- 1 strip 6¹/₂"-wide, subcut:
 - 4 squares 6¹/₂" (L)
- 1 strip 3⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 6 squares 3⁷/₈" cut □ to make 12 triangles (D)
 - 8 squares 1³/₄" (H)
- 1 strip 2³/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 8 squares 23/8" (A)
 - 4 squares 2³/₈" cut □ to make 8 triangles (I)
- 1 strip 2"-wide, subcut:
 - 16 squares 2" (J)
- Foundation patches

FROM GREEN BATIK, CUT:

- 12 strips 2¹/₂"-wide for binding
- 8 strips 4"-wide, subcut:
 - 24 rectangles 4" x 9¾" (P)
 - 8 rectangles 4" x 9½" (Q)
- 1 strip 3⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 8 squares 3⁷/₈" cut □ to make 16 triangles (D)

- 1 strip 3¹/₂"-wide, subcut:
 - 4 squares 3½" (B)
 - 4 squares 25/8" cut □ to make 8 triangles (G)
- 4 strips 2⁵/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 60 squares 25%" cut ∑ to make 120 triangles (G)
- 2 strips 2¹/₄"-wide, subcut:
 - 32 squares 2¼" (E)
- Foundation patches

FROM CREAM BATIK, CUT:

- 2 strips 6⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 8 squares 6⁷/₈" cut □ to make 16 triangles (N)
 - 2 squares 3⁷/₈" cut □ to make 4 triangles (D)
 - 1 square 3¹/₂" (B)
- 2 strips 6¹/₂"-wide, subcut:
 - 12 squares 61/2" (L)
- 1 strip 3⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 10 squares 3⁷/₈" cut ⊠ to make 20 triangles (D)
- 1 strip 3¹/₂"-wide, subcut:
 - 11 squares 3¹/₂" (B)
- Foundation patches

FROM GRAY BATIK, CUT:

- 2 strips 6⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 8 squares 6⁷/₈" cut □ to make 16 triangles (N)
- 1 strip 6¹/₂"-wide, subcut:
 - 4 squares 6¹/₂" (L)
- 1 strip 3⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 6 squares 3⁷/₈" cut ⊠ to make 12 triangles (D)
- Foundation patches

FROM LIGHT BLUE BATIK, CUT:


- 1 strips 7¹/₄"-wide, subcut:
 - 2 squares 7¼" cut ⊠ to make 8 triangles (M)
 - 1 square 6⁷/₈" cut □ to make 2 triangles (N)
- 1 strip 67/8"-wide, subcut:
 - 5 squares 6⁷/₈" cut □ to make 10 triangles (N)
- 1 strip 3⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 4 squares 3⁷/₈" cut ⊠ to make 8 triangles (D)
 - 8 squares 25/8" (O)
- Foundation patches

FROM MEDIUM AQUA BATIK, CUT:

- 2 strips 6⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 8 squares 6⁷/₈" cut □ to make 16 triangles (N)
 - 1 square 6½" (L)
- 2 strips 3⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 16 squares 3⁷/₈" cut ⊠ to make 32 triangles (D)
- 1 strip 3¹/₂"-wide, subcut:
 - 8 squares 3¹/₂" (B)
- Foundation patches

FROM LIGHT AQUA BATIK, CUT:

- 1 strip 6⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 4 squares 6⁷/₈" cut □ to make 8 triangles (N)
- 1 strip 3⁷/₈"-wide, subcut:
 - 8 squares 3⁷/₈" cut □ to make 16 triangles (D)
- 1 strip 3¹/₂"-wide, subcut:
 - 4 squares 3¹/₂" (B)

ASSEMBLY

Use an accurate ¼" seam allowance throughout to ensure all elements of the quilt fit together well.

UNITS 1 & 2 ASSEMBLY

 Referring to Quick-Pieced Triangle-Squares in Sew Easy Lessons, use white batik A's and medium blue batik A's to make 16 unit 1's (Diagram I-A).




2. In the same way, use white A's and turquoise batik A's to make 16 unit 2's (*Diagram I-B*).




SECTIONS 1–8 ASSEMBLY

 Make 60 full-size copies of the foundation section. Refer to *Paper Foundation Piecing* in *Sew Easy Lessons, Diagram II-A*, and the foundation section for color placement, piece a section 1 in numerical order, pressing and trimming after each patch addition. Make 8 section 1's total.



2. In the same way, referring to the foundation section for color placement and *Diagram II-B*, make sections 2–8 in the colors and quantities shown.




UNITS 3-8 ASSEMBLY

 Referring to *Diagram III-A*, join 1 green batik B, 4 white C's, and 4 green D's as shown to make a unit 3. Make 4 unit 3's total.

2. In the same way, refer to *Diagram III-B* and use medium blue B's, white C's, and medium blue D's to make 8 unit 4's as shown. Use cream B's, white C's, cream D's, turquoise D's, and gray batik D's as shown to make 12 unit 5's. Make 8 unit 6's using medium aqua B's and D's with white C's. Make 4 unit 7's using light aqua B's and D's with white C's.




3. Referring to *Diagram IV*, join green E's, white F's, and green G's as shown to make 32 unit 8's.



SECTION 9 ASSEMBLY


- Sew 2 white H's, 1 turquoise H, and 1 medium blue H together as shown in *Diagram V*. Center and *trim* the joined H's to 2⁵/₈" square.
- Lay out joined H's, 1 turquoise I, 1 medium blue I, 2 white I's, 2 white K's, 2 unit 1's, 2 medium blue J's, 2 unit 2's, and 2 turquoise I's as shown.
- **3.** Join patches and units into rows; join rows to complete 1 section 9. Make 8 section 9's total.



BLOCK U ASSEMBLY

 Referring to *Diagram VI*, lay out 1 medium blue L, 1 turquoise L, and 2 section 9's as shown. Join patches and sections as shown to make 1 block U. Make 4 block U's total.






Block U MAKE 4 Diagram VI

BLOCKS V-Y ASSEMBLY


 Referring to *Diagram VII-A*, lay out 1 cream L, 4 white M's, 1 turquoise N, 2 cream N's, and 1 gray N as shown. Join patches to make 1 block V. Make 8 block V's total.




 In the same way, refer to Diagram *VII-B* and join cream L's, white M's, light blue batik N's, and medium aqua N's to make 4 block W's. Use gray L's, white M's, gray N's, and light aqua N's to make 4 block X's. Use medium aqua L, white M's, and medium aqua N's to make 1 block Y.

BLOCK Z ASSEMBLY

 Referring to Diagram VIII, join 2 each white O's, light blue O's, white D's, light blue D's, white M's, light blue M's, white N's, and light blue N's as shown to make a block Z. Make 4 block Z's total.

PIECED BORDER ASSEMBLY


- Sew 6 green P's, 7 unit 8's, and 2 green Q's together as shown in the *Assembly Diagram* to make side border 2's. Make 2.
- Sew 6 green P's, 9 unit 8's, and 2 green Q's together as shown to make top border 2. Repeat to make bottom border 2.


QUILT ASSEMBLY

- 1. Join units, sections, and blocks into rows as shown in the *Assembly Diagram*. Join rows to complete quilt center.
- **2.** Join turquoise border 1 strips and cut to sizes shown in the *Assembly Diagram*.
- **3.** Matching centers and ends, join side border 1's to quilt center. In the same manner, join top and bottom border 1's to quilt top.
- 4. Repeat to add pieced border 2's.

FINISHING

- **1.** Layer and baste the backing, batting, and quilt top.
- **2.** Ruthann quilted an edge-toedge curly motif.
- **3.** Bind the quilt.






Assembly Diagram





TERRIE PETERSON EAGLE MOUNTAIN, UTAH

For her water-inspired design, Terrie Peterson imagined lots of blues and greens swirling around together. She says, "These traditional blocks have nice movement without a lot of odd angles."

SEW EASY Quick-Pieced Triangle-Squares

Use this method to make two matching triangle-squares at the same time.




1. Cut two squares ⁷/₈" larger than desired finished size of triangle-square.



2. On wrong side of one square, mark diagonal line from corner to corner. This will be your cutting line. Mark sewing lines ¼" away from each side of cutting line.



3. Place marked square on top of other square, right sides facing. Sew along marked sewing lines.



4. Cut along marked cutting line.



5. Press seam allowances toward darker fabric.

TIP: This method works for any size triangle-square. Cut squares the finished size of triangle-squares plus ⁷/₈".

SEW EASY[™] Paper Foundation Piecing

Piecing on foundation paper allows you to create complex or unusual designs with precision and ease.



1. Place fabric pieces larger than section 1 and 2 right sides together on back side of paper. Be sure fabric for section 1 is under that area and edges of fabric extend at least ¼" past stitching line.



2. Using 90/14-sized needle and a short stitch length so papers will tear off easily, stitch on line between two areas, extending stitching into seam allowances at ends of seams.



3. Open pieces and finger press the seam. Right sides of fabrics will be facing out on back side of pattern.



4. Turn unit over and fold back paper on stitched line. Trim seam allowance to ¹/₄".



5. Continue adding fabrics in numerical order, as you did with section 2. When all fabrics are added, trim excess paper and fabric along solid cutting lines.

SEW EASY[™] Paper Foundation Piecing cont.



6. Sew all paper-pieced units together, as directed. Leave paper foundations intact until block or top is sewn together.



7. After units or blocks are joined, carefully tear off paper foundations. Scoring paper with a pin or sharp-tipped scissors is helpful to remove foundation paper.



8. A foundation-pieced block or quilt top will be extremely precise, even with unusual shapes.
